

LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

This month I have asked John Bleho, the GC member with responsibility for member sections, to outline the GC's plans in this area.

At its best, the British Club experience is about family and friends, old and new, coming together to relax, laugh and enjoy common interests and passions. The Club's member sections are a key part of many members' fondest British Club memories and weekly social activities. Whether it's an evening pint with fellow Balut enthusiasts at the Churchill Bar or joining in one of four regularly scheduled weekly tennis mix-ins, member sections are where we catch up with like-minded souls whilst sharing in a mutually enjoyable contest or a post-game drink.

New members in particular find joining a Club section a wonderful icebreaker, a great way to make friends and catch up with old mates. The jokes and banter, shared drinks, and matching of skills, palate and wit create bonds and memories that often last a lifetime, or long after a member reluctantly departs Bangkok and Thailand.

The General Committee and Club management strongly feel that the Club's future lies in vibrant member-supported sections. We currently have active tennis, squash, balut, bridge, spoofer and golf sections. Thanks to the previous GC, we now have four excellent hard-surface tennis courts, an all-purpose back lawn pitch, a renovated cricket area and a beautifully landscaped back lawn area.

This GC is working to make full use of these facilities by members. By year's end, we hope to add hockey, junior netball and cricket sections to the Club's roster of sections that use the back lawn. We encourage members to suggest new sections and activities.

We will provide more Club support to the bigger member-supported sections like tennis. This includes a more active role for Reed Passmore, our Sports and Grounds Manager, and the hiring of Pierre Sequier as full-time tennis coach. Pierre, reporting to Reed, will be responsible for creating a full slate of serious and fun tennis activities for players of all ages and skill levels. Closely coordinated with the tennis section, these activities will also include inter-club regional events.

Reed is also working on a list of fun activity days to try out new sports at the club. These include water polo, volleyball and kids' rugby.

Many of the team sport sections have a number of non-member players. They come for their game or practice session on a mid-week evening and then disappear to a bar or restaurant elsewhere without enjoying our facilities. The idea of a sports membership giving limited access to Club facilities for such occasional users of the Club was informally discussed following June's EGM, and was well received by the members in attendance. The GC will refine this idea in consultation with the member sections and bring it back to the membership for formal consideration later.

Finally, the GC is looking to simplify the various by-laws governing the sections to improve corporate governance, transparency and member participation in the Club's sections.

Tastes – and members' interests – change. If you have a passion for a sport or activity that isn't currently represented in our member sections, let us know about it. 



In August, selected staff members will also receive Medical First Aid Training, including CPR. The first aid training will be led by the Lerdsin Hospital Silom.




MEMBERS' GATHERING



THE BRITISH WOMEN'S GROUP: A BRIEF HISTORY

Prior to May 1969, British women in Bangkok had no organised means of meeting one another. They met each other only at social functions or shared the rather dubious thrills of coping with children and shopping in a city that might have been quieter than it is today, but which was certainly not as convenient. As usually happens, groups would gather for informal coffee mornings at each other's homes.

So, on 29th May 1969, 57 ladies attended a meeting at the British Club. The Chairman of the temporary committee, Lily Milne, introduced the temporary committee and presented a Constitution to the assembled ladies, who were then invited to vote. The Constitution was accepted unanimously, the committee elected *en bloc* and by the end of the meeting, all 57 ladies had signed on as members.

The British Women's Group was born!

Lady Pritchard, the then-Ambassador's wife, graciously accepted the role of Honorary President, and today, Mrs Alison Quayle continues that tradition as our Patron.

The objective of the BWG is to enable members to meet socially, to welcome new members and to establish a programme of social, cultural and welfare activities. Our range of activities and services have altered and expanded over the years to meet the requirements of our membership.

Today we have many weekly activities such as bridge, quilting, mahjong and ten-pin bowling; and our famous "Cracker ladies", lead by past chairman and honorary member Shirley Kennedy, meet once a week to make Christmas crackers, with all proceeds from sales going to schools in the Bang Na area.

We have regular monthly activities, which include a coffee morning, lunch, newcomers' coffee, GNO (Girls' Night Out) and bookworms, to name a few.

Throughout the year, there are additional functions organised by the BWG. In the past, these have included evening events with partners – a cocktail party at the British Embassy,

a cheese and wine tasting, a "day at the races", and a treasure hunt around the "bars" of Bangkok!



The BWG is also a great supporter of the Ploenchit Fair, which is held annually and is the major fundraising activity of the British Community in Bangkok. Our "Ye Olde Tartes Shoppe" sells home baking made by our members and subsidised by donations from local hotels. All proceeds from this event go to local Thai charities via BCTFN.

We are also one of six women's groups in Bangkok who host the "Combined Women's Lunch". In 2008, it was the BWG's turn, and

we held a "James Bond"-themed lunch at The Oriental Hotel, where we raised over THB 500,000 for local charity Operation Smile.

This year, the British Women's Group celebrated their 40th Anniversary on May 29th. To celebrate, we held a black tie fundraising evening event featuring our hugely successful "Walk this Way" fashion show, with members strutting their stuff on the catwalk to music from the past four decades and wearing clothes designed by local Thai designers. It was a great evening of fun and entertainment, whilst at the same time, raising over THB 500,000 for three local Thai charities.

The BWG has an active Welfare Programme that is expanding all the time and includes supporting local charities through donations approved by the Committee. The Welfare Team also coordinates a pool of volunteers from within the Membership to work with charitable organisations. Each year, a local Thai school is selected, and the Welfare Team organises a Christmas Party for them. Our support of Thai charities, likewise, has expanded, as BWG fundraising has broadened in scope to meet the changing demands placed upon it.

Today, the British Women's Group is a continuing success story, thanks largely to the support, commitment and effort of its members, both past and present. The BWG is currently run by a committee of 26 and has over 250 members.






Whilst you might expect to hear this in some other month, Mother's Day is celebrated here in Thailand in August in honour and in celebration of HM Queen Sirikit's birthday on 12 August, as she is viewed as 'the mother of the nation'. This year, the Queen turns 77, and the Club offers its deepest well-wishes for a 'Happy Birthday' to Her Majesty.

The Early Life of Queen Sirikit, from Wikipedia:
Queen Sirikit was born on August 12, 1932, to the Prince of Chunthaburi and Mom Luang Bua Sanitvongse. Her name was given by King Prajadhipok and means the 'Greatness of Kitiyakara'.

When Sirikit was born, her mother gave her to her maternal grandparents who raised her for a year. Her father went to United States to work as the Secretary of the Siamese Royal Embassy at Washington D.C., while her mother accompanied her husband three months later after she gave birth to Sirikit. One year later, her parents returned to Thailand. Sirikit lived together with her family in Dheves Palace, near Chao Phraya River.

In 1946, when the war ended, her father moved to the United Kingdom to work as the Ambassador at St. James's, taking his family with him. The family moved to various countries including Denmark and France. While staying in France, she studied at a music academy in Paris, and she met King Bhumibol Adulyadej, who at that time had ascended to the throne and had been studying at Switzerland. The couple married on 28 April 1950, just a week before his coronation.

The match against the Japanese golfers marked the end of Maureen Gibson's tenure as Captain of the British Club Golf Section. Maureen



24th **The Eligible Bachelor** Starring **David Suchet**



PAST PARTICIPLE

Auspicious Melioris Ævi

As a change from being on the front cover of Outpost as Harry Potter, I have been asked to delve into the Club's past and put together a series of historical trivia about our Club, so I start out with five things you might not know about the early years of our Club.


3 The first Honorary Secretary was the Honourable Robert Abercrombie Forbes-Sempill, fourth son of the 17th Baron Sempill, who was also a guiding light in the construction of Christ Church's present building on Soi Convent. After leaving Siam, Robert served as a lieutenant in the Gordon Highlanders and, sadly, was killed in action in France in 1915.



1 One of the founding fathers in 1903, as our Club was opened as solely a male bastion, was Ralph Gibbons. A year earlier with William Tilleke, Ralph had been a co-founder of the law firm Tilleke & Gibbons, which still trades today. Ralph went on to become a legal advisor to the Siamese Ministry of Justice and a judge in International Court.

4 Originally, the Club was owned by Debenture holders, all British businessmen or diplomats. The original joining debenture cost 100 Ticals, as the Thai currency was then called in English (strangely, the Thais called it Baht). One Tical in 1903 was just under one shilling (5p), but it was soon revalued to 1/6½ (8p). The monthly subscription was 15 Ticals, which was originally 15/- but under the revaluation it became £1/3/1 – and we think we have currency problems these days.

2 Our first Clubhouse, a two-storey wooden house, was situated on the west side of a Soi connecting Windmill Road and khlong to the newly opened Suriwongse Road. On the east side was the Danish-owned Siam Electricity Company's Tennis Club. In 1919, the Tennis Club became what is now our Poolside, and the "Soi" still exists as the roadway from our Suriwongse gate to our Silom gate. A picture of our first Clubhouse (1903-1910) is the left-hand photograph in the Clubhouse reception.



5 Another one of our founding fathers was Walter Armstrong Graham, who was transferred from the Burmese Civil Service to become an adviser to the Siamese Ministry of Agriculture and then His Siamese Majesty's Commissioner for the Siamese Malay State of Kelantan, for which he was appointed Commander of the Order of the White Elephant. He was also a prolific writer producing "The French Roman Catholic Mission in Siam" (1903), "Kelantan – A State of the Malay Peninsula" (1908) and a two-volume book simply called "Siam" (1912).

The Author was Vice-Chairman of the Club from 2001 to 2003 and Honorary Secretary from 2000 to 2003 and in 2006 and 2007.

KHUN LAAK'S ON THE MENU


Our main recipe for August, Paella Valenciana, comes from the menu for the Club's Paella and Sangria nights, available every Wednesday. We have had this promotion for three months now, and we are extending the paella varieties. The Fruit Meringue is a Khun Laak recommendation and is available in the Verandah and Churchill. Mojitos and kiwi milkshakes are available throughout August in all outlets. Try them out... at home or at the Club!

Paella Valenciana

Serves 6.

400g (12oz) paella or risotto rice • 4-5 tbsp olive oil • 1 onion, chopped • 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped • 900ml (2pt) fish stock • 200ml (7oz) dry white wine • 40 saffron strands or 0.2g saffron powder • 250g (8oz) raw prawns, peeled • salt and freshly ground black pepper • pinch of cayenne pepper • 6 chicken thighs or 3 legs, halved • 250g (8oz) mussels, cleaned • 1 tsp paprika • 100g (4oz) cooked green beans or peas • 200g (7oz) canned red pimientos, drained • 3 tbsp chopped fresh parsley

Fry the onion in 2 tablespoons of oil in a shallow, wide 32-35cm (13-14in) *paella* pan (the rice pan), adding the garlic when it softens. Warm the stock and wine together, soaking the saffron in a cupful of it. Meanwhile, start a second frying pan, heating 2 tablespoons of oil. Fry the peeled prawns for 2 minutes (skip this if they are already boiled), then reserve. Rub salt, pepper and the cayenne pepper into the chicken pieces, and fry for about 10 minutes on each side, adding more oil if needed. Wash the rice in a sieve and drain. Add the rice to the onion in the *paella* pan, stir for a couple of minutes and sprinkle with the paprika. Add the saffron liquid and 1/3 of the stock and bring back to boil. Set the kitchen timer for 20-25 minutes. When the liquid has been absorbed, add another third of the stock and distribute the mussels, prawns, and beans or peas round the pan. When the liquid has nearly gone, add the remaining stock and give the mixture its last stir. Add the chicken pieces, bedding them into the liquid round the pan. Simmer on the lowest heat (best on a heat diffuser) for about 8-10 minutes. The liquid should all disappear by the time the timer rings. Check that the rice is cooked. Cut the pimientos into strips and lay these across the rice. Then turn off the heat and wrap the *paella* pan in newspaper or foil, to keep in the steam. Let it stand for 10 minutes. The flavours will blend and the last drop of liquid should disappear. Sprinkle with parsley and serve.




Fruit meringue with vanilla cream, hazelnuts and caramel

Serves 8-10.

1 basic meringue • 50g (1½oz) hazelnuts • 400ml (14oz) double cream • 2 tbsp icing sugar sifted • 1 vanilla pod, scored lengthways and seeds removed • 1 punnet of raspberries • 1 punnet of strawberries • 200g (7oz) caster sugar • small bunch of fresh mint, smallest leaves picked

Preheat your oven to 150°C/300°F/gas 2, and line a 30x10cm/12x4in. baking tray with a sheet of greaseproof paper. Then make your basic meringue mixture. Using a spatula, spread the meringue mixture onto the greaseproof paper so that it covers the whole baking tray. Carefully place the tray into the preheated oven and bake the meringue for an hour until crisp on the outside, but chewy and soft inside. Take the meringue out of the oven, and leave to cool. Put the hazelnuts on a baking tray and pop them into the oven until they're light brown – don't turn your back on them because they burn easily. Crush them lightly in a pestle and mortar and put to one side. Whip the cream with the sifted icing sugar and vanilla seeds until it forms soft peaks. Using your fingers, gently press down on the centre of the cooled meringue to create a hollow in the middle of it. Sprinkle in some of the crushed hazelnuts, then some berries and some vanilla cream. Repeat these layers until you have used up all the ingredients. Put the caster sugar into a saucepan, add 200ml (7oz) water and bring to a boil, then reduce until the liquid turns into caramel. Carefully drizzle this over the top of the meringue, and finish with a scattering of mint leaves.



From Poolside: Mojito

Serves 1

1.5oz Bacardi light rum • 3-4 tsp brown sugar or sugar cane • 6 pcs lemon wedge • 6-8 leaves mint

Mash the mint and sugar together. Add light rum and lime juice, and pour over the ice. Top up with soda water. Use a highball glass.




Kiwi Milkshake



5. For the fringe, accordion-fold a 25-inch length of red paper streamer, and cut slits 1/4 inches apart along one side, stopping 1/4 inch from the edge.

Craft Materials:

- Toilet paper tube
- Tissue paper
- Paper streamer
- Scissors
- Glue

6. Unfold the streamer, and place the chili's bottom point at one end of the fringe. Slowly wrap the fringe around the chili in a tight upward spiral, sticking it in place with a glue stick as you go. Trim any excess fringe, and allow the glue to dry. Come fiesta time, parties can simply tear the tissue paper to break open the piñata.


